Staffing

For the 2010 – 2011 school year two Board initiatives impacted scheduling and staffing in Albemarle County Public Schools

- Class Size Increase (+1 @ 4 – 12 : -2.87 for Elementary, -5.73 for Middle, -8.26 for High) {-16.86 FTE – (\$1,113,957)}
- 8 Period Day for MS & HS (-3.44 FTE for MS, -9.24 FTE for HS {-12.68 FTE – (\$837,780)})
- *Total FTEs eliminated: -2.87 Elementary, -9.17 Middle, and -17.5 High*

Teaching 5 out of 8 vs. 6 out of 8

(Math, Science, Social Studies, English, & World Languages)

- The number of teachers who taught 6 out of 8 sections in 2010 - 2011:

Albemarle	60
Monticello	39
<u>Western Albemarle</u>	<u>30</u>
Total	129

- 129 teachers (FTE) x 6 periods = 774 teaching periods
- 774 teaching periods ÷ 5 periods = 154.8 teachers (FTE)
- 154.8 (FTE) - 129 (FTE) = 25.8 (FTE) difference
- 25.8 (FTE) x \$65,000 = \$1,677,000*
- Decreased teaching loads by 1 period for all middle and high schools would equal approximately 60.72 FTEs = \$3,946,800
