Department Overview:






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


Transported Level of Care (Month)

Budget, Grants, and Project Updates:

Grant Updates

- Prepared and submitted an AFG grant application for Fire Equipment as approved by the Board on December 2, 2024
- Received notification of RSAF grant award on January 2, 2025, for medication control access lockers and the procurement of medication
- Submitted six-month progress reports for two active Safer Grants, ensuring compliance with the grant requirements.
- Published the Environmental Assessment Report for the Holly Grove Radio Tower project for public comment

Capital Updates

- Final inspection of Mineral Engine 2 sometime in April.
- Medic 6 arrived and working on getting in service
- RFP closes on February 20th for Brush Truck.
- Conducted a pre-build design for the new fire and EMS boat
- Reviewed projects for Co. 6's carryover and developing a plan to move forward with Capital Improvements.

Other

- Continued development and implementation of the drug box plan and DEA license acquisition
- Meeting with the Management Oversight Group's EMS committee and volunteer rescue chiefs to discuss ongoing projects and initiatives
- All dual facing cameras have been installed. Only a few side and rear cameras needing installation.



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Staffing, Recruitment, and Career Development

- Current staffing levels: 78 of 86 positions filled.
- Testing in February for written and physical agility to fill vacancies.
- Promotions of Battalion Chief, Station Lieutenant and 3 Advanced EMT Providers

Training Division:

- Tuesday, January 7th held Fire 2 certification class for five current staff members
- A combined Louisa County High School fire class, Culpeper CTEC Fire class, and the Culpeper County Volunteer Fire & Rescue Association Fire Academy came together for several trainings and a Firefighter 1 burn.
- Louisa County High School EMT class students are doing well and will be testing National Registry in early/mid-April.
- Training Division held a CPR and Basic First Aid course for the Town of Louisa Public Works and Town Police.
- Scheduling Louisa Water Authority for their annual fire extinguisher training.
- We recertified 12 of our current staff on CPR as well as other required courses.

Total Training hours of the month of January: 211hrs

Community Outreach & Fire Prevention:

- Assisted the High School with helicopter landing for their recruitment opportunity
- Attended blasting operations alongside the Virginia State Fire Marshal's Office.
- Reviewed several site plans distributed by Community Development.

Emergency Management:

- Attended multiple meetings/calls for the snow event on January 6, 2025
- Local Declaration Declared. EOC at a Monitoring Level for snow event on January 6, 2025
- Members participated in quarterly training with the Central Virginia Incident Management Team.
- Louisa EmComm (Amateur Radio) held Winter Field Day. This is an event that test the abilities of operators to set up remote operations and make contacts. It was a successful event and a good learning opportunity.

Goals Moving Forward:

- Continue to fill vacancies, continue to evaluate a career development plan, and continue to stay competitive with surrounding localities.
- Continue to enhance recruitment efforts through community outreach and partnerships.
- Continue to work with our dispatch center to streamline emergency responses and correct resource allocation.
- Continue to develop and update our long-term capital improvement plan for equipment and infrastructure upgrades for both career and volunteer buildings and equipment
