

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
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July 01, 2025, to July31, 2025




August 01, 2024, to July 31, 2025 (Rolling Year)



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Grants, Capital, and Other Updates:

Grant Updates

- RSAF TJ-C03/06-25: We received notification that we were awarded \$26,681.97 for a 50% match on IV infusion pumps and video laryngoscopes; both which will improve the quality of EMS care we provide.
- SAFER EMW-2020-FF-01104 (Volunteer R&R): This grant is nearing closeout. We have funding for a few more sets of volunteer turnout gear for new volunteer firefighters. AFG Grant for Firefighting and Safety Equipment. Still waiting on status. The awards have not started.
- SAFER EMW-2024-FF-01464: (SAFER EMW-2024-FF-01464: (Hiring) Waiting for status. Awards for this grant have not started.
- SAFER EMW-2024-FF-01614: (Volunteer R&R): Waiting for status. Awards for this grant have not started.

Capital Updates

- Boat has been ordered, and pre-built meetings are complete. Construction has begun. Inspection and delivery expected in mid to late November.
- Radio Tower site work continues. Motorola is expected to begin its radio equipment and installation on August 11th.
- Brush Truck RFP process has been completed, and the contract has been awarded to build two brush trucks, one for Fire Station #5 (Locust Creek) and one for Fire Station #8 (New Bridge).

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Other Updates

- Held the planning phase to begin advertising for a citizen's academy to begin in September.
- All Career firefighters and interested volunteers completed the annual comprehensive physical and early detection screenings.

Staffing, Recruitment, and Career Development

- Current staffing levels: 86 of 86 positions filled.
- Twelve new members started on June 30.
- Finalized our career development plan.

Training Division:

- Driver Pump Operator (DPO) course finished July 26th
- The Recruit Academy started June 30 with the Firefighter 1 course start date of July 7th with a testing date of August 29th. There are 12 career members and 1 volunteer member in the academy.
- July "PUSH" Training was water rescue with the assistance of Spotsy and Rescue Station 3's new Boat3
- EMS Supervisors held several on shift CEU's
- Pittman Enterprise donation of Fuel Tanker Trailer (DOT 406) for Hazmat Training
- Finalized the prep for the High School EMT which will start August 18th.

Community Outreach & Fire Prevention:

- Met with Spring Creek for a Community Event
- Met with Shenandoah Crossings Resort to discuss emergency response

Emergency Management:

- Attended Surry's Evaluated VOPEX Exercise.
- Attended IMT Training

Goals Moving Forward:

- Continue to evaluate the career development plan and continue to stay competitive with surrounding localities.
- Continue to develop and update our long-term capital improvement plan for equipment and infrastructure upgrades for both career and volunteer buildings and equipment.
- Continue to look at the data, call volume, and districts to plan for future needs.
