Temporary Authorization Request (TA085) – Reissuance

Dear Mr. Woolfolk:

The Virginia Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) Northern Regional Office (NRO) is in receipt of a request to reissue the temporary authorization for the above referenced facility in accordance with 9VAC20-81-600.F.4.d of Virginia Solid Waste Management Regulations (VSWMR). The submittal was prepared on behalf of Louisa County Sanitary Landfill by LaBella Associates in a letter dated August 31, 2026.

The requested authorization is to temporarily increase the maximum daily disposal limit from 75 tons per day to 300 tons per day while the pending Part B major permit modification is under review. Based on the information provided, including the VDOT approval letter dated February 9, 2026, the queueing analysis, operational capacity evaluation, and supporting documentation submitted with the request, DEQ has determined that the temporary increase in daily disposal limit can be accommodated without adversely impacting facility operations or surrounding infrastructure. This temporary authorization request extends the previous temporary authorization request issued on April 8, 2026.

The temporary authorization reissuance has been requested in accordance with 9VAC20-81-600.F.4.c(2)(b) and F.4.d to prevent disruption of ongoing waste management activities. The major amendment application for the expansion that incorporates this action was received on June 20, 2025, and is currently undergoing revisions by the applicant and DEQ's technical review process.

The temporary authorization reissuance is hereby granted with the conditions as identified below and an effective reissuance date of October 6, 2026. The DEQ reserves the right to rescind this temporary authorization if the facility fails to comply with any of the conditions identified below. Compliance with the conditions identified below must be met and maintained for the entire period of the temporary authorization. Note that this temporary authorization is limited to 180 days from the effective reissuance date.

The conditions for this temporary authorization are:

1. The facility shall operate in compliance with the VSMWR, Solid Waste Permit 567, and all applicable local, state, and federal laws and regulations.
2. During the period of this temporary authorization, the Louisa County Sanitary Landfill may accept waste at a maximum daily disposal limit not to exceed 300 tons per day, as described in the request dated February 20, 2026.
3. This temporary authorization does not approve any modification to the design, footprint, or permitted disposal capacity of the facility. Filling activities shall not exceed the currently permitted landfill capacity of 923,300 cubic yards.
4. All landfill operations shall continue to be conducted in accordance with the approved facility plans and operations manual, including types of waste accepted, traffic management, and operational controls.

As provided by Rule 2A:2 of the Supreme Court of Virginia, you have 30 days from the date of service of this decision to initiate an appeal of this decision, by filing notice with:

In the event that this decision is served to you by mail, three days are added to that period. Please refer to Part Two of the rules of the Supreme Court of Virginia, which describes the required content of the Notice of Appeal, including specification of the Circuit Court to which an appeal is taken, and additional requirements governing appeals from decisions of administrative agencies.
