**A RESOLUTION CELEBRATING THE 50TH REUNION OF THE LOUISA COUNTY
HIGH SCHOOL CLASS OF 1976**

WHEREAS, the Louisa County High School Class of 1976 celebrates its 50th High School Reunion in 2026, marking five decades of friendship, achievement, service, and a shared connection to Louisa County; and

WHEREAS, the Class of 1976 came of age during one of the most significant periods in the history of public education in Louisa County, as the community moved from segregated schools toward one unified school system; and

WHEREAS, that transformation began in 1965, when 13 Black students first integrated Louisa County High School under a "freedom of choice" plan, and continued through the full desegregation and consolidation of the County's schools, including A.G. Richardson High School, by September 1970; and

WHEREAS, as students in the years immediately following full integration, the Class of 1976 was among a generation that helped lead Louisa forward, learning together, competing together, celebrating together, and forming friendships across a community that was itself learning what it meant to come together as one; and

WHEREAS, the 248 graduates of the Class of 1976 shared more than classrooms and hallways, they shared an important chapter in Louisa County's history, building relationships that

crossed old boundaries and for many, grew into lifelong friendships that remain strong 50 years later; and

WHEREAS, their story continues to define Louisa County today: our strength is found in our connections, to one another, to our shared history, and to the community we call home; and

WHEREAS, members of the Class of 1976 carried that spirit of connection and service into their lives and careers, becoming business owners, educators, healthcare professionals, public servants in local, state and federal agencies, members of the military, community leaders, neighbors, mentors, and friends; and

WHEREAS, fifty years later, their reunion is more than a celebration of a graduating class; it is a celebration of how far Louisa has come, the history its people share, and the lasting relationships that continue to connect generations of Louisa County residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, on this 8th day of September 2026, that the Louisa County Board of Supervisors hereby congratulates the Louisa County High School Class of 1976 on the occasion of its 50th High School Reunion and proudly honors its members for their place in Louisa County's history, for helping lead the way during the formative years of an integrated Louisa County High School, and for demonstrating through five decades of friendship and service that Louisa is strongest when Louisa is connected.
